Feather Craft boats were built using the scrap metal left over after World War II. The aircraft companies were all looking for new markets to shift their production to and create new goods. Walter Knight founded Feather Craft boats in Atlanta in 1946. His families background in the scrap metal business helped propel Feather Craft boats as a 1950s staple.

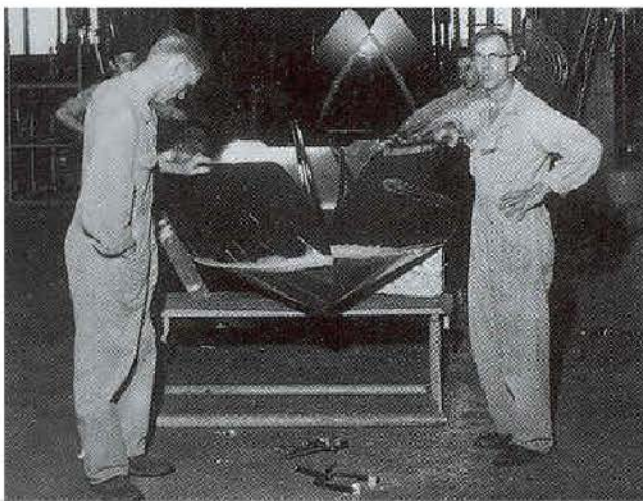


Lightweight, aluminum fishing boats were Feather Crafts biggest seller. The most popular model was the called **The Vagabond**, introduced in 1951. This fishing boat was roughly 14 feet long and got to speeds of 45 horse power. **The Vagabond** was originally offered in native aluminum only, but later was offered in anodized gold or blue in hopes of attracting female boaters.

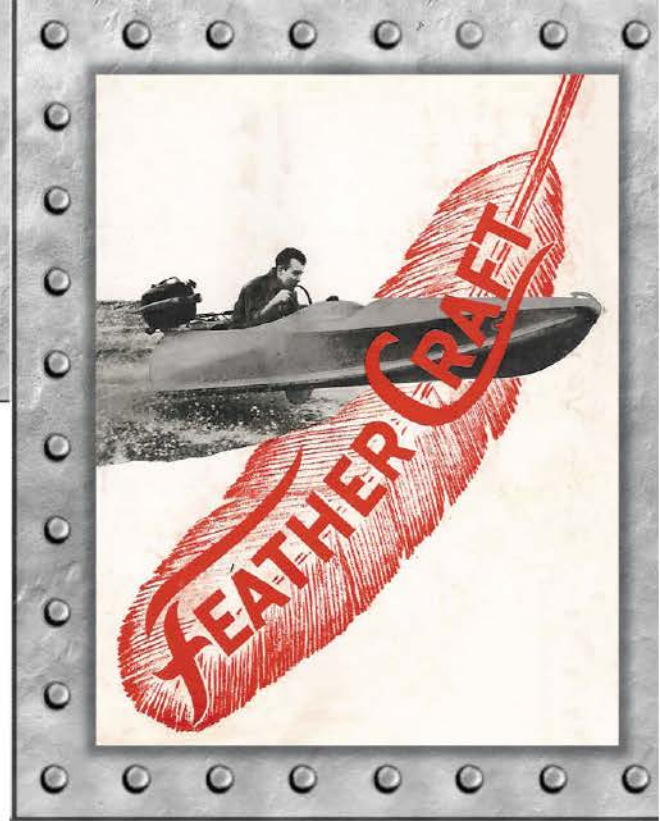


The Vagabond
